

After the Armistice Ball is the new novel by local author Catriona McPherson (of Fintloch, New Galloway). It is the first in a series of crime novels looking back to the golden age of amateur detectives. Dandy Gilver is bored to a whimper in the spring of 1922 – the War is over, her husband is home, her children are off at school – and a little light sleuthing seems like harmless fun. What starts as a case of theft, however, soon leads to a brutal murder in a lonely Solway cottage. Society and the Law would rather not rock the boat and it is up to Dandy alone to see that justice is done.

After the Armistice Ball is published by Constable on 28th July, and costs £16.99 in hardback. A launch is being held at Designs Gallery, Castle Douglas, 30th July at 6.30pm.



BLAZE OF GLORY FOR GLENKENS FIRE CADETS



The Glenkens Fire Cadets are pictured here at their recent open evening at the New Galloway Fire Station. The event was held to give the local community, parents and councillors the opportunity to see for themselves the achievements of the cadets since their formation in September 2004.

The fifteen cadets demonstrated a selection of basic drills using fire-hoses, reels and ladders. They were then presented with Basic First Aid Certificates by Tony Turner, the Chairman of the Police and Fire Committee.

The project was set up with funding from the Local Action Fund. This fund is aimed at offering youngsters in Scotland opportunities to participate in positive activities which divert them away from anti-social behaviour. The cadets are able to learn teamwork and co-operation skills and benefit from self discipline and community responsibilities.

Norrie Davis, the Safety Commander from Dumfries and Galloway Fire and Rescue Service said "The youngsters deserve credit for all the effort they have put in so far."

LOCAL ARTISTS

David Williams, Clatteringshaws

David Williams is an artist and sculptor who lives and works at Clatteringshaws Loch, near New Galloway. His artworks mainly take the form of automata, drawing engines, juggling machines and wall reliefs which are inspired by his fascination for astronomy, archaeology, mechanics, Greek geometry and other ancient sciences and technologies. He works with copper, leather, wood and other materials that historical scientists would have used. Although David's works are based on complex intellectual concepts and philosophies, they have an immediate and captivating appeal, especially for young children. "It is important that the sculptures are fun and accessible," says David.

Originally from the Black Country, David spent much of his career as a specialist teacher, lecturing in design, sculpture, prop making and special effects at colleges and universities up and down the country. He has exhibited at many galleries in the UK and abroad, including the Voltaire Gallery in London, the Paris International Design Bienniale, the Saltburn Artists Gallery and the Gardner Arts Centre at The University of Sussex. He has undertaken many sculptural, pyrotechnic and mechanical commissions for a range of organisations such as The Woodlands Trust, The Teeside Development Corporation, The Middlesborough Development Company and Rotary International, making a variety of pieces including clocks and timepieces and steel gateway sculptures.

Fiona originally comes from York, and Ian from Lancashire, but the couple met whilst working in France 12 years ago. They have also travelled abroad and spent a year working on farms in Australia before settling back over here with their young family.

Fiona and Ian would like to thank everyone for their welcome and support both to the village itself and the Post Office.

Although no great changes are planned for the post office, you will notice a few differences. A larger range of gifts for children, books, cards and stationery are in place and Fiona and Ian would welcome any suggestions for improvements you may have. Post Office services available in New Galloway include motor vehicle licences, foreign currency ordering, E111 and personal banking for Clydesdale, Cooperative, First Direct, Lloyds TSB, Smile, Cahoot and Alliance and Leicester. Utility bills can be paid at the Post Office and phone top-ups are also available.

BALMACLELLAN COMMUNITY COUNCIL

The Balmaclellan Community Council AGM was held in April. Alan Pallister stood down as chairman after 4 and a half years and was re-elected to the committee as vice-chairman. Although Alan has thoroughly enjoyed his time as chairman, he felt it time for a change and will still be active in the council in a supporting role. The Community Council would like to take this opportunity of thanking Alan for his service in his former position as chairman.

Jane Douglas was elected the new chairman and Joyce Harvey was reelected as secretary. Fiona McKinnon was elected as treasurer although Jane Douglas will continue to administer the village hall bookings.

Other community council news is the arrival in Balmaclellan and Parton of recycling bins — they are for the collection of green, clear and brown glass items and are located on the left hand side of the hall in Balmaclellan and in the carpark at Parton next to the hall.

A number of members of the pupilc attended the meeting to raise a variety of concerns over the recent planning permission to build three houses in the centre of the village at the site of the former petrol station. These points were noted and the discussions are ongoing.

The Village Hall is now awaiting external decoration and this should be completed in due course.

The May meeting of the Balmaclellan Community Council takes place on Monday 30 May to which members of the public are invited.

THE ROYAL BURGH OF NEW GALLOWAY & KELLS PARISH COMMUNITY COUNCIL

The Annual General Meeting was held on 9th May in New Galloway Town Hall. At the meeting, Brian Edgar stood down as Provost after serving for 6 years which is the maximum term allowed under the constitution. He thanked all members for their support and hard work during his term in office and wished his successor all the best in the future.

Councillor Prentice then took the chair to invite nominations for the new Chairman/Provost. Mr. Gordon Lindsay was proposed and seconded, and there being no other nominations, he thanked the members for their confidence in him and accepted the position, moving up from his previous role as a hard working Vice Chairman.

The new Vice Chairman is Mrs. Margaret Sainsbury and Mr. John McGaw remains in the post of Treasurer. The secretarial duties will continue to be handled by Mrs. Cathy Hinton who is not a member of the Community Council

At the monthly meeting which followed the main topic was the Town Hall. Mr. Derek Crichton, Area Manager for the Stewartry was in attendance. Many issues were raised regarding the Town Hall — disabled access, the broken town clock, leaking guttering, catering facilities, interior and exterior decoration amongst others. Mr. Crichton took note of all the concerns and agreed to arrange site visits from relevant council officials where necessary and to take whatever action was possible within the budget constraints.

DALRY COMMUNITY COUNCIL

At the March meeting, members heard about progress and continued their discussion of the following issues: location of the Youth Shelter; out-of-hours medical cover; the provision of a timetable at the bus shelter; tidying up of the Motte; progress with miscellaneous improvements of pavements, roads and verges; problems with street lights; the location of bottle banks in the village; the proposed windfarm at Blackcraig; affordable housing in the Glenkens and the Glenkens Walking Initiative.

Support was reported from various groups within the community regarding the possibility of an entry in the 'Beautiful Scotland in Bloom' competition. Representatives of Dalry Primary School attended the meeting and gave a presentation on the school's Eco Project which would tie in well with the village's entry. It was hoped that a meeting of interested parties would be held in the near future to appoint a sub-committee to oversee the entry arrangements.

PC Bruce updated members on outstanding and resolved police matters in the area.

NEW GALLOWAY -Our Historic Burgh

by Helen Bolton PART XXV

St Margaret's Church

Towards the end of the 19th Century the need was felt, in New Galloway, for a more permanent home for the Episcopal Church of Scotland. Prior to 1882 occasional services were taken by the Rev W M Ramsay, Rector of St Ninians, Castle Douglas, who travelled to various local towns on a small pony.


Miss Jane Maitland of Kenmure, great-niece of Adam Gordon, the last Viscount Kenmure, and her cousin Miss Copland of Colliston, pioneered St. Margaret's Church, New Galloway, each contributing generously to the expenses involved, and Miss Maitland undertook to engage clergy to take services during the holiday period when many visitors from England would be staying in the area. Services were held in New Galloway Town Hall lower hall, but by 1903 the numbers had increased so much that the congregation overflowed into passages and onto the stairs!

Some action was needed and meetings were held at "The Cottage", the home of Mr and Mrs John Courtenay, attended by Miss Maitland, Mr Augustus Spalding of "The Holm", Balmaclellan, and his sister the Hon Mrs John Grey, It was decided that a small church should be built in New Galloway and just over £100 was promised by the members of the

Mr Courtenay drew up a rough sketch and a plan was prepared by Mr W H Harrison, a London architect. A site next to "The Cottage" was chosen, and Mr Courtenay supervised the building which was undertaken by local tradesmen Mr R Johnstone and Mr Wm Harley.

By 17th August 1904 the new Episcopal Church of St Margaret of Scotland was complete, at a cost of just over £512, the entire cost being covered by money subscribed.

The new Church was dedicated on 20th August 1904 the Dean of the Diocese deputising for Bishop Campbell, Music was supplied by the choir and organist of St John's Church, Dumfries. There were no less than five clergymen in the large congregation present at the service. When Bishop Campbell visited St Margaret's later, he was greatly impressed by the little Church and its furnishings, and he praised the committee for their energy and enthusiasm which had led to the building of this fine Church.



Miss Maitland moved to Dumfries about this time and as Mr Spalding and his sister were only autumn residents, church affairs became almost the entire responsibility of Mr and Mrs Courtenay, a situation they accepted for a period of ten years.

The Hon Mrs Grey died in late 1907 leaving a bequest of £1000 and also her organ and music to St Margaret's. Unfortunately the organ was found to be unsuitable and was sold for £15, this money becoming the foundation of a permanent organ fund.

As a lasting memorial to his sister, Mr Spalding had a chancel erected, 21 feet long, slightly narrower than the nave, with oak panelling and flooring, built by Mr Johnstone and Mr Coskerie. Two stained glass windows in the chancel were given in memory of Helen Mary Grey,

Bishop Campbell consecrated the Church on 10th September 1908 and a confirmation service was held the following year.

Much of the material for this article was taken form the booklet "The History of the Episcopal Church of St Margaret of Scotland, New Galloway 1904-2004." twelve times. However according to GMT, the BBC and all the clocks and watches in the house, the actual time is 10.25. So be it. New Galloway time is what it is and, as the sun is shining, at least we agree that it's daytime.

On December 13, 1872, a special Council meeting was held, to make an attempt, in the words of the Minutes, "to remove a stigma that had for many years adhered to the Burgh, in consequence of the utterly worthless condition of the Town Clock as a timekeeper, considering that numerous fruitless

efforts had been made to bring the old Clock into an ordinary working state." A quotation was obtained from Mrs Gillet & Brand,

of Croydon, Surrey, to supply a clock of first-rate workmanship with a patent gravity escarpment and four illuminated dials, the figures and minutes of cast iron and glazed with patent opal glass, for the sum of £120.

Subscriptions were raised, ranging from one shilling to Mrs Maxwell of Glenlee's gift of £20.10 shillings. Viscountess Kenmure [Picture: Town Clock photographed mid-afternoon]

A few minutes ago the Town Hall clock struck donated £3. There were 272 subscribers in all, raising a total of £187. 8 shillings and 5 pence; this included 5 shillings and sixpence from 'A Friend to Time' and 2 shillings and sixpence from 'Punctuality'. Mrs Louise Bellamy Gordon paid for the recasting of the large bell, long

since cracked, which had been given by the sixth Viscount Kenmure in 1711.

The Clock was set in motion by Mrs Maxwell,


under the instruction of Charles Price of the Croydon Horological Works, one minute before noon on Friday, September 20, 1872. A Public Dinner was given to the Provost in honour of the event. Four months later, a violent storm, coupled with a defect in the installation

of the Clock, caused the West face to fall out and be destroyed. It was replaced at a cost of £17. 2 shillings.

Today the works of the "utterly worthless" clock may be inspected in Kircudbright Museum.

Sometimes one wonders if History doesn't repeat itself? Ron Russell







Dalry pupils were rewarded with an all expenses-paid trip to Badaguish for their hard work with their science presentation





Community Fire Safety Message MAKING YOUR HOMES SAFER

Having a BBQ should be a safe and enjoyable experience for everyone. But cooking over hot coals can be hazardous. It is easy to be distracted when you have your family and friends around you whilst cooking. To avoid injuries or damage to property follow these simple tips:

- Make sure that your BBQ is in good order
- · Keep a bucket of water, sand or a garden hose nearby in case of emergencies
- Make sure your BBQ site is flat and well away from sheds, fences, trees and shrubs
- Use only enough charcoal to cover the base of the BBQ to a depth of about 50mm (two inches)
- · Keep children, garden games and pets well away from the cooking area
- · Never leave the BBQ unattended
- When you have finished cooking, make sure the BBQ is cool before trying to move it.
 Empty ashes onto bare garden soil
- Never put ashes straight into a dustbin or wheelie bin. If they are hot, they can melt the plastic and cause a fire
- · Remember BBQ's should never be lit indoors

GAS BBQ'S

- · Bottled gas BBQ's need special care when being turned on and off
- Make sure the tap is turned off before changing the gas cylinder
- Change the gas cylinder in the open air if possible, or open doors and windows to provide good ventilation
- When you have finished cooking turn off the gas cylinder before the BBQ controls to ensure any gas in the pipeline is used up
- If you suspect a leak to gas cylinder or pipework:
- Brush soapy water around all joints and watch for bubbles
- If you find a leaky joint, try to tighten it, but don't over tighten it

STORING GAS CYLINDERS

- . Do not keep more spare cylinders than you need
- Store gas cylinders outside
- · Keep gas cylinders away from frost and direct sunlight
- Never store gas cylinders under the stairs of your home if you are upstairs this is your means of escape from a fire
- Enjoy yourself, but remember too much alcohol and fire never mix!
