

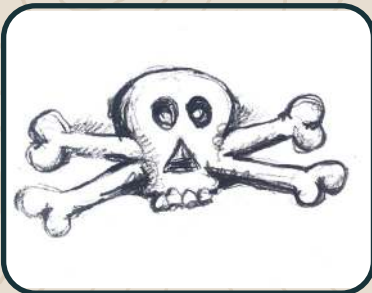
Grave Encounters at Kells

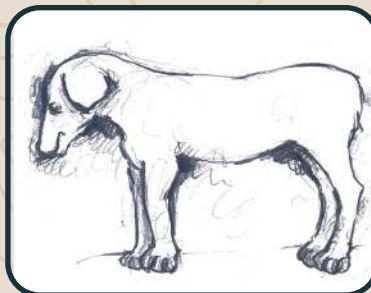
Can you find the carvings on the gravestones (in no particular order), based on the simple illustrations? Please write the person's name beside it.

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Kells Kirkyard is classed as a Category B Listed Building – this means that it has been recognised as having 'special' architectural or historic interest.

These carvings are hundreds of years old and many still have the year visible. Can you spot which one is the oldest?



Some of the carvings represent what the people did for a living, can you guess what the person at Carving 6 did?

Carving 7 is called a 'winged soul'. These are fairly common, see if you can keep count of how many there are as you go round the gravestones.

BONUS QUESTION

Next to one of the gravestones sits a rare example of a wooden WWII battlefield cross that's been brought over from France. Can you find it and write down the name that appears on it?

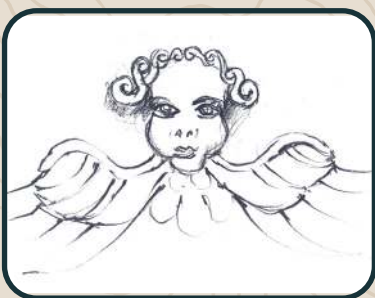
