COVID

PARKING

There is NO PARKING at the woods throughout this event. The top and bottom carparks will be out of bounds each day. Please park in the town centre and walk up, or use the FREE SHUTTLE BUS to access the woods. It will shuttle to and from the Harbour Square each day of the festival from 10-3. Limited parking available in the evenings.

ACCESSIBILITY

The main path in the woodland is wheelchair accessible, but unfortunately, not all the activity stations will be. Contact Helen.Keron@dumgal.gov.uk for more details. There will be limited disabled parking spots available for drop-offs and pick-ups at the top carpark.

There will be temporary toilets (portaloos) available behind the Classroom for the duration of the Festival.

NOTE

There is no food and drink available at the woodland apart from the evening bbqs. Please be sure to bring enough for yourself and your group for your stay.
